Description			
<i>Provide a short description of the event and its activities.</i>			
<p>The goal of the event was to introduce the participants to a series of educational, museological and commemorative settings and spaces related to the historical events of the Second World War in Croatia (the city of Zagreb and the Jasenovac area) where the participants had the opportunity to share knowledge with and to learn from experts in various related fields (history, memory, Jewish studies, Roma history, cultural history of remembrance). The event serves as a starting point of the overall project in terms of mapping the needs for intervention in these areas, ensure the shared pool of</p>			

knowledge of all partners, working towards the common working agenda of partners, and assessing the project's proposed plan of action.

The event consisted of several interrelated events.

On 20 May 2025, a group of 33 students of the Zagreb's Third Economic High-school (Treća ekonomska škola Zagreb), with 4 teachers and members of the project team visited the Memorial Area Jasenovac (JUSP Jasenovac), a site of the former concentration camp in Croatia. They attended the workshop provided by the Memorial Area Jasenovac educators, where they learned through presentations and group work within the museum about the specificities of persecution and genocidal policies and events perpetrated by the Ustasha regime 1941-1945. They then filled in the survey whose aim was to provide the data about the learning outcomes of this type of educational activities. The results will serve as a point of comparison with the similar type of data about the learning outcomes that will be collected after new learning tools are developed during this project.

On 28 and 29 May 2025, partners from Croatia, Romania and Germany participated in a series of workshops, discussions and study visits, including the kick-off meeting of the project. The participants learned about and discussed the commemorative initiatives and monuments in the city of Zagreb (Stolpersteine, Dotršćina memorial park, city monuments to the events of the Second World War and other historical events) and shared knowledge with various local experts (members of the Jewish community Bet Israel, professor from the Chair for Jewish and the Holocaust studies at the University of Zagreb, Ivo Pilar Institute of Social Sciences, independent activist, members of the Centre for promotion of tolerance and Holocaust remembrance). A study visit to Jasenovac area enabled sharing of knowledge with experts from the Memorial Area Jasenovac and the Roma Memorial Centre Uštica (Romski memorijalni centar Uštica). Total of 17 experts and members of the project teams from all the project partners (from Croatia, Romania and Germany) participated in the event.

The meeting of the Steering Committee of the project was also held on 28 May 2025.
